

**Gary Stoneham** is the Chief Economist of the Department of Sustainability and Environment in Victoria, Australia.

Following ten years as a research economist with the Australian Bureau of Agriculture and Resource Economics in Canberra, Gary is now employed by the Victorian government specialising in environmental policy design.

Gary's team have made use of experimental economics and field pilots to test and refine new institutions/markets for environmental goods and services associated with private land use. The BushTender program is now applied across all Victorian regions and more recently the team has been developing a multiple-outcomes approach to environmental procurement.

Gary has recently been awarded a Senior Research Fellowship from Land and Water Australia in recognition of progress made in designing and applying market-based approaches for the environment.

In 2005 Gary was the recipient of *The Bulletin's* "Smart 100" award.
